eac selects new president

Mr. Todd Haynie selected as the New President of Eastern Arizona College

fter an extensive process, including a national candidate search, applicant screening and interviews, and candidate forums to solicit public input, the Graham County Community College District Governing Board announced at its regular monthly meeting in October that it has selected Mr. Todd D. Haynie as the 22nd President of Eastern Arizona College. The search committee, comprised of the District Governing Board and representatives from EAC's faculty and staff met on October 16 to assess the results of the interviews, forums, and public comments before emerging from executive session to take an official vote. The position will fill the office of current EAC president Mark Bryce, who will retire from the College in May of 2018.

"It's an incredible honor to be chosen for this position," said Haynie. "I am looking forward to moving over to the District Office as soon as possible so I can get up to speed and we can make a smooth transition."

Haynie earned a Master of Business Administration (MBA) with distinction from Northern Arizona University in 1999, a Bachelor of Arts in Media Arts from Brigham Young University in 1996, and he is a proud alumnus of EAC, having earned an Associate of General Studies degree in 1993.

Haynie has served the College since August 2000 and is well-known both within EAC and the community. He is currently serving as the director of marketing and public relations at Eastern Arizona College. He has also served EAC as the assistant director of Admissions and

Scholarships. Prior to that he worked as a producer at Educational Management Group, in Scottsdale, where he produced educational videos. He has also served as an adjunct instructor in the Computer Department at EAC.

A well-respected and talented individual, Haynie is known for his strong work ethic, positive attitude, and excellent communication skills. He is committed to continuing the tradition of excellence at EAC.

Haynie will begin his service on May 16, 2018.

eac receives largest gift in its history

EAC receives largest gift in its history from Max and Clara Curtis Bennett

ith their children raised, Charles Max Bennett and Clara Curtis Bennett enjoyed vacationing to different parts of the world each year. They appreciated the freedoms found in America and could see the benefits that education brings to our country. They also saw where other countries had made great strides forward as they made investments in their future through education.

When Clara passed away in 2004, Max wanted to do something that would keep her memory alive and help make the most of a difficult circumstance. Mrs. Bennett had often spoken of her time at Gila Junior College (Eastern Arizona College in the 1940's) as being some of the happiest of her life. As a result, Mr. Bennett called the EAC Foundation to see how he could start a scholarship in Clara's name.

As Max met the recipients of Clara's scholarship and saw them succeed in reaching their education and career goals, he decided to make the scholarships permanent. He added provisions in his

estate plan to create an endowment that would benefit students at Eastern in perpetuity.

Mr. Bennett passed away this past spring after seeing 14 years of students prepare for brighter futures because of this scholarship. Through the donation of his home and a generous portion of his retirement savings to the EAC Foundation, he created an endowment that provides annual support to student scholarships and the EAC Music Department. It will generate scholarship assistance sufficient to award six full scholarships for tuition, books, and room and board each year. It will also provide approximately \$40,000 in program assistance to the music department annually.

This donation will bring great opportunities to many students each year and help the music department offer improved experiences.

The gift from the estate of Max and Clara Curtis Bennett is the largest gift to support Eastern Arizona College in its history.
