The name of the school has changed

In 1888, when the charter to begin a school was received, the school was named St. Joseph Academy. Through the years the named changed to include Latter-day Saint Academy, Gila Academy, Gila College, Gila Junior College, Gila Junior College of Graham County, Eastern Arizona Junior College, and Eastern Arizona College.

The last 125 years brought revolutionary changes in technology. The automobile, airplane, radio, television, computer, satellite, and cellphone each brought changes to our lives. 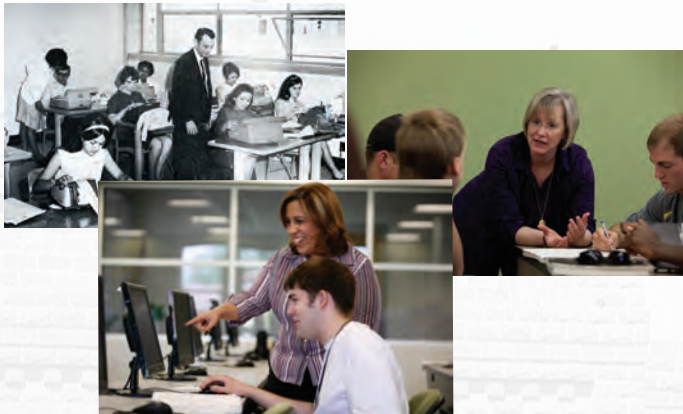
The facilities have grown and improved

Individuals have excelled in so many fields of expertise: law (past Arizona Supreme Court Justice Jesse Udall, Class of 1914); science (Henry Eyring, Class of 1916); decathlon champion (Jesse Mortensen, Class of 1927); politics (U.S. Senator Jeff Flake, Class of 1982, and U.S. Secretary of Interior Stewart Udall, Class of 1938); professional football (Jerry Smith, Class of 1963; Paul Robinson, Class of 1965; Steelers coach John

Mitchell, Class of 1971; Mark Gastineau, Class of 1977; Sean Dykes, Class of 1984; Michael Haynes, Class of 1985; and others); and even those on the movie screen (James Tolkan, Class of 1951; and Nick Nolte, Class of 1960).

Here are a few more notable alumni:

Spencer Levan Kimball, Class of 1936, received a Rhodes Scholarship to attend Oxford University in England. He went on to become an internationally recognized expert in insurance law and the dean at several law schools.

Dr. Anthony Sanchez, Class of 1973, was recognized as a researcher with the Center for Disease Control in dissecting the molecular biology of the Ebola and Marburg filovirus family during its outbreak in the late 1980's. He also worked to solve the Hantavirus outbreak in 1994.

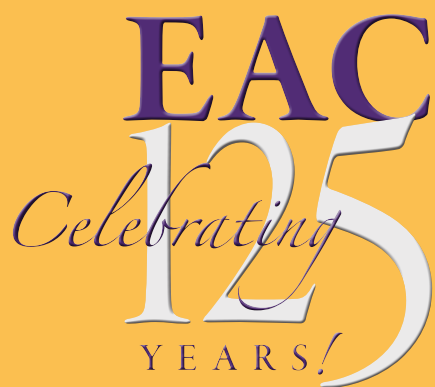
Families have a history of giving

The students of Eastern Arizona College have benefited from a legacy of giving. One example is William Wilson Pace and Catherine Rankin Pace. They moved to Thatcher, Arizona, in part so their children could receive a good education. Mr. and Mrs. Pace sponsored a scholarship as well as established a student loan fund. One of their children started the Carlotta Pace Home Economics Scholarship which was awarded for many years. Two of the Pace's grandchildren sponsor scholarships today - The Fred and Olga Pace Scholarship and the Anna Deane Millett, Don & Carlotta Pace Scholarship. Over one hundred students have received the opportunity to build skills and experience for a brighter future because of the Pace family.

Another family committed to giving is Emil Crockett and the Emil Crockett Insurance Agency Scholarship. Started by Emil Crockett in 1953, this scholarship will be awarded to its 50th student recipient this year. Emil Crockett's son-in-law, Kenneth Lake continued to give the scholarship during his years running the business. Steve Lake, Emil's grandson, sponsors the scholarship today. The family finds great satisfaction in giving to help the community and is glad to help generations of students find brighter futures through education.

It's not really possible to adequately condense the rich history of Eastern Arizona College in so short an article; volumes have already been written.

Even so, Eastern Arizona College is a monument to many men and women who had a vision of the life-changing power of education. They gave time, talent, sweat, and tears to build an institution that would prepare students for the future. They transformed a desert into an oasis both physically and symbolically. What a fitting title for those choosing a yearbook title in 1928. We have each been made better through our association with Eastern Arizona College.
