EAC Announces the Establishment of Four New Scholarships

The Eastern Arizona College Foundation was created in 1967 to support the success of the College and help bring financial support to its students and programs. Through the years, the primary focus has been scholarship assistance for the students. This has meant financial assistance to thousands of students in the 48 years since its inception.

Scholarship assistance at Eastern comes in several different ways. A couple times each year, the Foundation sends appeals by mail sharing the need for scholarship funds. Sometimes these mailings ask for support of our general scholarship fund and sometimes they are for a specific project like scholarships for the nursing program. An envelope has also been added to the GilaGram newsletters to provide a convenient opportunity for alumni and friends of the college to support student scholarships.

A number of individuals, service clubs and businesses have expressed the desire to sponsor a scholarship on an annual basis. They have established scholarship criteria with the EAC Foundation, including a selection committee like the Alumni Association Scholarship committee or EAC faculty. They send a donation annually and a student is chosen each year who meets the criteria. The scholarship donors are able to meet the recipients and receive updates on their progress at school, as well as attend recognition events here on campus.

Some donors have chosen to create “endowed” scholarships. In these cases, larger donations are made to the Foundation. The endowment assets are invested such that scholarships are funded only from earnings on the investments. This enables the scholarship to continue in

perpetuity - honoring the individual(s) the donor wished to name with the establishment of the scholarship.

Recently, four new scholarships were established – The G. Wayne and Phillis Blake Scholarship, The Patrick and Kristie Putnam Scholarship, the Dr. Dorine Chancellor Athletic Scholarship and the Dr. Ron Keith Memorial Music Scholarship.

The G. Wayne and Phillis Blake Scholarship

Phillis Blake and her daughter Pamela Blake King established the G. Wayne and Phillis Blake Scholarship. Gale Wayne Blake, Class of 1966, and Phillis DeCloss Blake, Class of 1967, attended

Eastern Arizona Junior College and enjoyed their experiences at the College. Their family has great memories and fondness for the College. Wayne’s mother attended Gila Junior College. Wayne’s sister Joan also attended Eastern and married Clarence McBride who later was a faculty member at the College. Pamela Blake King was student body vice president at Eastern.

When Wayne passed away, the family decided that establishing a scholarship would be a great way to keep special

memories alive and at the same time help students who need financial assistance to pursue their goals for education.

The G. Wayne and Phillis Blake Scholarship is awarded to students from Miami, Globe, or San Carlos high schools who demonstrate financial need.

This endowed scholarship will generate tuition funds in perpetuity in memory of G. Wayne and Phillis Blake.

The Kristie and Patrick Putnam Scholarship

Kristie Putnam graduated from Eastern in 1994 and then earned additional degrees to become successful in the healthcare field. She and her husband are now pleased to be able to give back to others needing assistance gaining an education and skills for a strong career.

Kristie and Patrick Putnam started an annual scholarship that provides full annual tuition to students who are single parents studying business, nursing, science or computer science.

Rigorous selection process is conducted by independent committee of former college presidents, university CEOs, provosts and professors.

Eastern Arizona College has been selected out of nearly 8,000 postsecondary schools across America as the recipient of a Best Value College award. The award is issued by University Research & Review, a company dedicated to improving the process of how a student selects a postsecondary school.

The committee chose Eastern Arizona College because it passed rigorous standards including a combination of cost, accreditation, variety and quality of school programs, and student satisfaction with the institution.

“Providing an excellent and quality education for a low cost is the hallmark of EAC,” explained Todd Haynie, EAC’s Marketing and Public Relations Director. “EAC has always represented a great value to our students and community. It’s an honor to be recognized for this distinction by University Research and Review.”

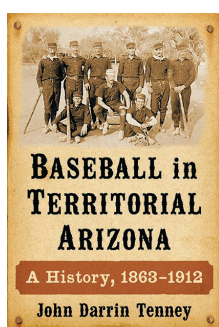

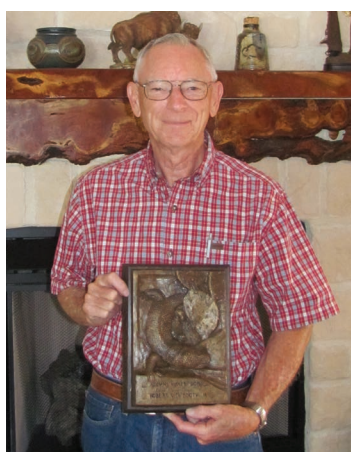

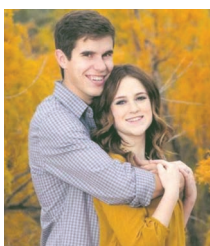
