Matt S. Duncan, '57, moved to Pima, Ariz., with his family in the 1940s, where they picked cotton to make ends meet. In 1955, he hitch-hiked to Phoenix to enlist in the US Navy as he thought that was his only option for a better future. The recruiter wasn't there, so he hitch-hiked back home. Fortunately, he met a representative from Eastern Arizona Junior College who offered him a tuition scholarship to attend.

That event transformed Matt's life.

At EAJC, Matt met **Mary Carrasco, '56**. They married and raised a family. Recently, they celebrated 67 years together.

Matt continued his education at the University of Arizona with a master's in counseling and school administration. He also earned a Ph.D. from California Western in counseling and human behavior.

During his career, he has been a counselor, therapist, researcher, and a teacher. He also scripted and hosted documentaries about

psychology. One TV series, *As Man Behaves*, received an Emmy nomination.

Herman J. Spencer, '64, received an associates from EAJC. He then volunteered for the draft with the US Army. Following his honorable military service, he earned a bachelor's of business administration degree at New Mexico State University, and a Master's of Business Administration degree at Arizona State University.

In 1970, Herm married Kay Garrotto in Sioux City, Iowa.

Herm held management and leadership positions at Cochise County Hospital in Douglas from 1971 - 1977. He served as hospital administrator of Northern Inyo Hospital in Bishop, Calif. from 1977 until his retirement in 2003.

Herm has been blessed with good health: competing in over 200 races, including 23 marathons and 40 half marathons. He was the volunteer race director of the annual Hospice of the Owens Valley Road Run in Bishop,

Calif. for 17 years.

Harold Seballos, '72, came to EA after graduating from high school. He has great memories of his experiences at EA and at his apartment across the street from Mark Allen Hall.

He recalls a life-changing moment when fellow student, **Raúl Trevizo, '72**, taught him how to study – something he had never really learned. As a result, Harold went on to graduate from EA, advance in his job at Phelps Dodge Mining, and later pass an entrance test to gain employment with the US Post Office.

Mr. Seballos had a good career with the post office and now enjoys retirement.

His friend, Raúl Trevizo, went on to become an educator and later a pastor. Msgr. Raúl P. Trevizo, V.G., has served as pastor of St. John the Evangelist Catholic Church in Tucson, Ariz., since 1993 and is the Vicar General of Hispanic Affairs for the Diocese of Tucson.

Steve Titla, '78, first attended EA in 1973. He enlisted in the US Marines and after a Far East Tour returned to graduate in 1978. Steve transferred to ASU, graduating with a bachelor's in 1980 and then a Juris Doctorate from the ASU Law School in 1983.

He passed the Arizona Bar exam in 1983. He currently works as an attorney at Titla

and Parsi with offices in Globe and Scottsdale.

Lorilee "Lori" Brockmeier, '82, graduated from EA and went on to Northern Arizona University to earn her teaching degree.

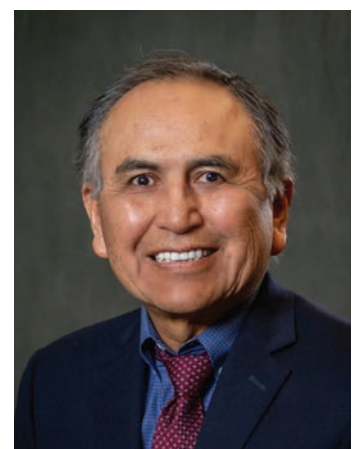
She had a phenomenal 30 years of teaching and coaching our Arizona youth in the San Carlos Indian Reservation, Miami, and Peoria.
